8. Practical information

Local currency, exchange rate and ATMs

The local currency of Malaysia is Malaysian Ringgit (MYR. Symbol: RM). The exchange rate as of May 14, 2024, is USD 1 to MYR 4.40. Banknotes come in denominations of RM100, RM 50, RM 20, RM 10, RM 5, RM 1.

VISA and Mastercard credit cards are widely accepted across Malaysia. ATMs are easily accessible in cities and towns, including main shopping centers, inside banks and at gas stations. The amount of cash allowed into Malaysia is the equivalent of USD 10,000 per individual. For amounts exceeding USD 10,000, there is a need to declare at the customs.

Foreign currency exchange can be done at banks, money changers, or hotels. US dollars are not accepted in Malaysia.

Climate

Malaysia has a tropical climate and is generally hot and humid throughout the year. It is recommended to wear light, breathable clothing, use sunscreen, and stay hydrated. An umbrella or raincoat may be useful for unexpected showers.

Average Temperature in July: 31°C (87.8°F)


Average Humidity in July: 70%

Electricity

The standard voltage throughout Malaysia is 240 V, 50 Hz.

Main power plugs and sockets in Malaysia are type G.



Insurance

Participants may wish to take out adequate travel insurance and health insurance before leaving their home countries. The hosts have no insurance coverage for the participants and will not be held responsible for any accident that may occur during the event.

Tips and taxes

Tipping is not a common practice in Malaysia, and you do not have to leave a tip unless stated otherwise. Most restaurants apply a surcharge directly to your bill which is supposed to cover tips, therefore Malaysian workers do not expect a tip.

Restaurants in Malaysia will add a 10% government and 5% service tax to your bill automatically; therefore, tipping in hotels is not required. You can leave bellboys, room service, and housekeepers a tip if you would like, but it is not required.
